Observance of the Father of the Nation's Birth Centenary



Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sheikh Hasina, Launching much awaited Mujib Borsho Celebration

The year-long celebrations marking the 100th birthday of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the architect of independent Bangladesh, got underway throughout the country on 17th March, 2020. As this year marked the birth centenary of the Father of the Nation, with the Government already defining the year as "Mujib Borsho" the whole nation basked into a rejuvenated mark of jubilance and so did Bangladesh Public Administration Training Centre. With a view to smooth celebration of the birth centenary at the national level; the government has formed a 102-member national committee headed by the Hon'ble Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina to manage, supervise and administer the overall activities taken nationally.

Keeping consistency with the national program, BPATC has taken manifold activities to celebrate the 17th March, birthday of Bangabandhu as well as the 'Mujib Barsho' and also observed the 17th March with colorful and festive mood. This Centre commenced this historic day with hoisting of the national flag with the rise of the sun in presence of the respected Rector along with the faculty members and officials of the Centre and the participants of various courses. Then the placement of floral wreaths on the portrait of Bangabandhu was taken place following the day-long activities set previously.

Torjoni: a pathway to our freedom



Candles of Torjoni Ignited to Remove Darkness

One of the memorable efforts among the activities taken by the Centre to observe the "Mujib Borsho" was to establish "Torjoni", a souvenir in honor of the great leader father of the nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Various components of the sculpture demonstrate different essence relating to the life and philosophy of Bangabandhu along with the history of the liberation war of Bangladesh. The index finger (Torjoni) of the Father of the Nation represents the Freedom of the Nation. Above all, this sculpture contains 20 candles and each of the candles metaphorically stands for five bright years of the leader signifying hundred years altogether. There are six parallel candles in the middle represent the Six Point movement. Walkways to Torjoni (Red) are the struggles and hurdles of the Father of the Nation during the journey up until Freedom. Seven candles in one side represent the 07th March 1971 as the call for Freedom. Finally, flowers blown in both sides of the walkway to Torjoni is success achieved out of struggles of the Father of the Nation.







BPATC has started operating an official setup named 'Mujib Borsho Secretariat' concentrating on the responsibility for celebrating the birth centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Muiibur Rahman. Under the leadership of respected Rector of this centre, a four-member team is coordinating the activities taken regarding Muiib Borsho. On behalf of this centre, this secretariat has already propelled few programs and targeted to hold 12 series seminars on the life, philosophy, iconic leadership, unwavering support and blood-soaked sacrifice of Bangabandhu. This secretariat has offered support for conducting research on Bangabandhu as well as suggested the concerned to include 'Bangabandhu Studies' in different course curriculums.

Bangabandhu Chair

A 'Bangabandhu Chair' has been set up at BPATC campus in a bid to mark the birth centenary of the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. Eminent novelist Selina Hossain has been appointed as the Bangabandhu Chair for the term between 1st March 2020 and 30th June 2021. She will provide advice on research works on Bangabandhu and offer her assistance on preparing a training module on life and philosophies of the Father of the Nation. She will also take part in each of the 12 seminars arranged throughout the year on the theme of Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. As Bangabandhu Chair, Selina Hossain has already authored several essays as part of Bangabandhu Memorial Essay Series. In these essays Selina Hossain has covered issues like Bangabandhu's thought on women development, his connection with politics and culture, six-point demand of Bangabandhu, Bangabandhu's role in upholding social ideals, role of Bangabandhu's public address in achieving victory and Bangabandhu's role as a writer. She will also write some more articles focusing on

Academic Activities


Updating Course Curriculum

BPATC has included a completely new module titled 'Bangladesh and Bangabandhu Studies' in the course curriculum of Foundation Training Course (FTC) and Special Foundation Training Course (SFTC). This module will help the newly recruited civil officers of this country to acquire knowledge on the genesis and spirit of the liberation war and the great role of Bangabandhu for the holy independence of Bangladesh. This module will infiltrate the philosophical aspect of leadership, life and works of Bangabandhu among the participants.

Online Course on Bangabandhu

BPATC has taken an initiative to launch an online course titled "Bangabandhu's Administrative and Development Policy". Being an apex institution in the field of imparting training to the civil servants of Bangladesh, BPATC takes on itself the prime responsibility of orienting the government employees with the life and works of our father of the nation, Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman. It has been decided that the duration of the course will be five days and three separate modules on "Philosophy and State Plan of the Father of the Nation", "Socio-economic Concept and policy of the Father of the Nation", and "Development Plan of the Father of the Nation" containing relevant topics have been prepared. Initially, the participants of all ongoing courses and selected employees of BPATC will take part in the online course and gradually with development of the course and subject to the approval and support of MoPA, all the employees of the People's Republic of Bangladesh will undergo the virtual training.



Resumption of 94th SSC & 129th ACAD

Due to the onslaught of the COVID - 19 - a highly contagious and deadly virus, the human civilization came to a stand-still. As per the instructions propagated by the Government, BPATC also had comply by stopping all its the academic activities during the initial period of the outbreak - later phase of March 2020 to be exact. Thus 94th Senior Staff Course (SSC) designed for Joint Secretaries and officers of the equivalent rank from Armed Forces and 129th Advanced Course on Administration and Development (ACAD) designed for Deputy Secretaries and officers of equivalent rank from the Armed Forces were also postponed in the mid-way to flatten the curve of the pandemic.

After a break of almost five months, the courses mentioned above recommenced on September 06, 2020. Under the able guidance and apt supervision of the Rector of the Centre, so much ground work was done and a detailed work plan was chalked out to ensure the safety and security of the officers coming to take part in the courses. Social distancing, wearing protective gears, abiding health protocols and maintaining hygiene etc were strictly monitored by the Course Management Teams.

70th Foundation Training Course designed for the entry level civil service officers was scheduled to be held from 27th October 2019 to 23rd April 2020. But due to the outbreak of the novel Corona virus, the course was postponed on March 22, 2020. However, after a considerable lull in all activities, Ministry of Public Administration (MoPA) with the kind consideration of honorable Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina issued an instruction to complete the remaining part of the course through online.

The Certificate Awarding Ceremony was held on 15th October 2020 and Hon'ble Prime Minister, Sheikh Hasina, graced the event online.
